1 Relief all round: arabesques and the like abound in the elite wing of the ravishing Art Nouveau asylum (page 194). To dramatically raise the profile of your own walls, look no further than Lincrusta's dado panels, which come on a 10yd roll costing £284. 2 Lluís Domènech i Montaner, the architect of Pere Mata (page 194), was a poster boy for Art Nouveau in Catalonia. 4 Jazz-age funk: the main bathroom in Mark Ronson and Grace Gummer's 1827 town house (page 213) is a masterclass in understated sophistication, thanks in no small part to the quartet of quietly glamorous 'Savoy' wall lights from Jamb. 5 Good news for anyone whose 1960s Marco Zanuso sofa and chairs sadly *didn't* come in their original plush upholstery, unlike the Ronson-Gummers' (page 207): Linwood's cognac 'Omega' velvet is similarly sumptuous and sticky-toffee-sauce coloured (£53.90 per m). 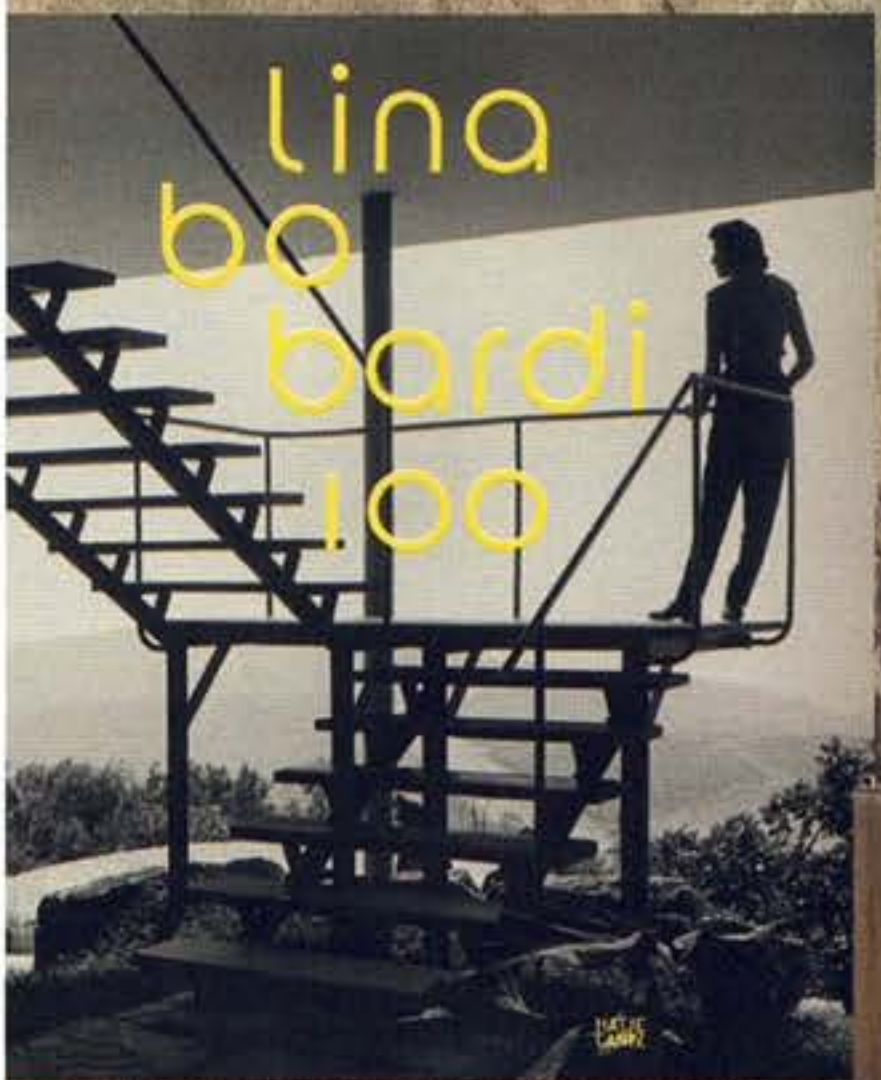

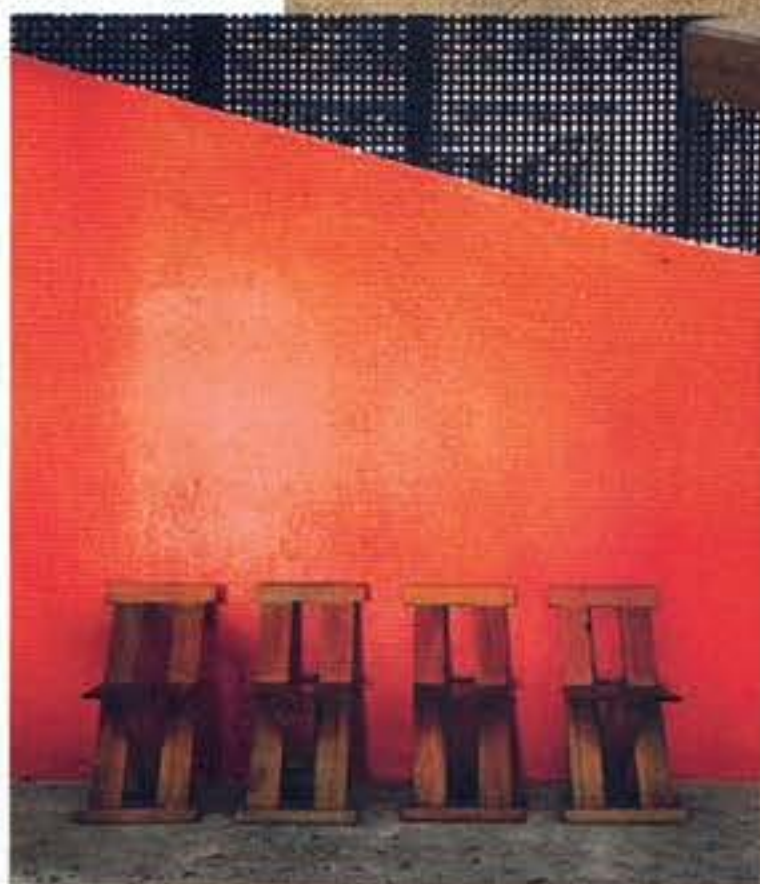
